## Mandela images on display in NT

An exhibition featuring works by Nelson Mandela - depicting his 18 years of imprisonment on Robben Island - has opened in the Great Hall of the Northern Territory Parliament.

Despina Voudouris brought the exhibition from Sydney to Darwin to help raise money for a South African orphanage for children affected by HIV-AIDS.

"This is based on a project that I'm working on called Ozcots," she said.

"Last year, in September, I went on a holiday to South Africa and while I was there I went and did some volunteer work with an AIDS orphanage called Cotlands.

"I've come back and I'm on an absolute mission to support this orphanage."

The exhibition finishes on July 22.
